Down the road from the home of Fred Wagner. (now the Byzantine Catholic Church Rectory) The gambrel barn, then belonging to Fred and Annie Wagner at their Sunny Brook Farm, is now the Captain James Ely Miller American Legion Post 833.

The land was once part of Fred's 180acre Sunny Brook Farm. The land was purchased in 1928 from WWI American aviator Clarence Bernard Maloney who flew with the RAF until injured in France some seven months after Captain Miller was killed in action.

The Hall Floor has been replaced as well. There was extensive structural damage due to water and insects over the past 100 plus years. Due to Palermo Flooring, the floor is structurally sound and will last at least another 100 years. All work was completed 3/28/2024.

Since 1935, American Legion Boys State has been one of the country's most revered and selective government instruction programs, teaching high school students about the operation of local, county and state governments. Fifty American Legion departments conduct this program, serving more than 17,000 young men ach year. The American Legion Auxiliary sponsors a similar program for young women called Girls State.

At American Legion Boys State, young men learn about the rights, privileges, duties and responsibilities of a franchised citizen. Elected and appointed local officials offer participants objective, practical training in city, county and state governance, and activities are conducted such as legislative sessions, court proceedings, law enforcement presentations, assemblies, band, chorus and recreational programs.

American Legion posts select participants to attend their respective Boys State program after receiving recommendations from school officials. Usually posts, local businesses or community organizations pay the cost of attendance.

American Legion Boys State participants go on to achieve success in a variety of fields. Notable alumni include astronaut Neil Armstrong, basketball legend Michael Jordan and national television news journalist Tom Brokaw.











Honor Flight - Long Island

On May 29, 2004, President Bush dedicated the World War II Memorial to honor "The Greatest Generation," 59 years after the end of WWII. One year later, the Honor Flight Program was inaugurated.

Earl Morse and Jeff Miller, co-founders of Honor Flight, realized that many World War II veterans would never have the opportunity to visit the memorial that was erected in their honor.

It is the intention of Honor Flight Long Island to honor as many of our fellow Long Islanders, who helped to preserve our freedom, as we can by providing them a free trip to visit their memorial. Along with WWII, we are now taking Korean War, Vietnam War and other conflict veterans to Washington D.C.



New York State Cold War Certificate

To whom awarded:

The Cold War Certificate may be awarded to any current New York State citizen or a person who was a New York State citizen while serving in the Armed Forces of the United States during the Cold War period, 2 September 1945 to 26 December 1991, whose entire service was honorable.

Standards:

This certificate may be awarded only to those persons whose discharge certificate indicates service under the conditions of "honorable" (Honorable Discharge) or "under honorable conditions" (General Discharge under Honorable Conditions).

This certificate may be awarded posthumously to a designated survivor of the deceased. Not more than one certificate shall be awarded to any one person. This is a one-time issue.

How awarded:

Applications for the New York State Cold War Certificate will be made using **DMNA Form 105**.

Posthumous applications will be submitted using the same mechanisms, using **DMNA Form 105-1**.

You will need to use Adobe Reader (or Adobe Acrobat) to view the applications above. Adobe Reader can be downloaded for free from <u>https://get.adobe.com/reader/</u>

Applications may be submitted By Mail to: Division of Military and Naval Affairs, ATTN: MNGA-AWD, 330 Old Niskayuna Road Latham, NY 12110

or electronically by Email to:ng.ny.nyarng.list.cold-war@army.mil

For security reasons, email attachments must be in 'PDF', 'JPG' or 'GIF' format. Attachments in any other format are blocked by the email system.

All requests will be sent to the New York Division of Military and Naval Affairs with supporting documents attached/ enclosed to validate service during the Cold War period.

Documentation will include a copy of the recipient's Report of Separation (i.e., WD AGO Form 53-55, DD Form 214, or NGB Form 22, etc.). Documentation must include a discharge certificate indicating the character of service as "honorable" (Honorable Discharge) or "under honorable conditions" (General Discharge under Honorable Conditions). Ensure documentation submitted clearly indicates New York State residency while on duty in the Armed Forces during the applicable dates.

Do not send original proof of military service documents. Please ensure only the last 4 digits of the Social Security number are visible. It is also recommended the Date of Birth be crossed off.

If you do not have, in your possession, the required documentation necessary for eligibility or require confirmation of your federal service, you may request a copy of your service record by writing to:

National Personnel Records Center, Veterans Special Actions Division, 9700 Page Boulevard, St. Louis, MO 63132.

Application for New York State Cold War Recognition Certificate

Privacy Notice

Authority: Military Law, section 247.

Principal Purpose: To secure sufficient information from an applicant or a requester to determine eligibility and to process requests for the Cold War Recognition Certificate.

Routine Uses: Information is used for official purposes within the Division of Military and Naval Affairs; specifically, to process requests for Cold War Certificates. This information may be used in accordance with established uses for the Division of Military and Naval Affairs.

Disclosure: Disclosure of the last four (4) digits of the Social Security Number and other personal information is voluntary. However, failure to provide complete information may hinder proper identification of the requester, and may prevent the agency from determining eligibility of the requester for the Cold War Certificate.

Instructions: Fill out this application and mail with **supporting documentation** to the Division of Military and Naval Affairs, ATTN: MNGA-AWD, with your proof of military service. Acceptable supporting documents include any official government or military document that contains the recipient's name, address indicating New York State residency, last four numerals of the recipient's Social Security Number, and dates of service showing at least one day of service during the Cold War era (September 2, 1945 to December 26, 1991). Examples of acceptable supporting documentation include DD Form 214, WD AGO 53-55, and NGB Form 22. DO NOT SEND ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS.

Lifetime Liberty Pass



Starting April 1, 2024, New York veterans and Gold Star families will be granted free access to state parks, campgrounds, historic sites and recreational day areas throughout the state, thanks to an expansion of the Lifetime Liberty Pass Program, the governor's office announced.



This program will now give the following benefits:

- Free vehicle parking at New York State Parks and DEC-operated campgrounds, day use areas, boat launch sites, historic sites, arboretums, and park preserves
- No greens fees at State Park-operated golf courses
- No swimming pool entrance fees at State Park-operated pools
- Discounted campsite and cabin rentals at State Park and DEC-operated campgrounds

Gold Star Family Members will receive the program's benefits when they present a Lifetime Liberty Pass card to employees at staffed parks. Lifetime Liberty Pass applications will be available on the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historical Preservation's website starting on April 1. Veterans who have a veteran status designation on their New York State DMV ID can present their ID to employees and don't need to apply for a card.



Starting April 14, each day Team EVA ran a marathon which honored local servicemen killed in action and who were linked to the communities they called "home." By April 20, the team had visited over **300 Points of Honor** and laid flowers, cones, wreaths, and flags in memory of our Fallen Heroes. In addition to Brookhaven Town Hall, **Team EVA's** stops included Northport, Long Island National Cemetery, Eisenhower Park, Shelter Island, Sag Harbor, Calverton, Westhampton, Patchogue, Medford, Long Island's South Shore, Oyster Bay and Bayville. The marathon began with an opening ceremony at Huntington Town Hall Veteran's Plaza.

The journey ended in **Casale's** hometown of Glen Cove with a special closing ceremony at the Glen Cove City Hall as she and her team crossed the final finish line.

Eva Casale, is an ultra-marathon runner who can run long distances consecutively for days. **Eva** has taken her gift of running and is using it to make a difference for veterans. By the end of "7 Marathons in 7 Days" Team EVA had run 184 miles.

Running for a worthy cause

Ultra-marathoner Eva Casale raised \$2,500 to support vets at Warrior Ranch in Calverton

Last week, on a gray, cold, rainy Thursday — conditions perhaps better suited for a movie-watching marathon than a traditional one — Eva Casale and a handful of runners ran 26.2 miles to honor the nation's veterans.

"I think about who we're honoring," Ms. Casale said of what runs through her mind as her feet hit the pavement. "On a day like today when the weather isn't the best, we say that our heroes, our angels up above, are showing us tears of joy that we're moving our mission in the right direction." Each day during her eighth annual Team EVA

"Every Veteran Appreciated" week, Ms. Casale, 59, of Glen Cove runs a marathon to raise money and support for veterans across Long Island. Her first race kicked off at Huntington Town Hall last Sunday morning, and her final marathon ended in downtown Glen Cove Saturday. where she placed flowers and flags. Calverton's Warrior Ranch, a nonprofit that offers equine therapy to

profit that offers equilie therapy to veterans, first responders and their families, was Ms. Casale's last stop after a long journey last Thursday. She presented the ranch with a check for \$2,500.

"It is an incredible honor to me," Warrior Ranch founder and president Eileen Shanahan said of Team EVA's third annual stop at the nonprofit. "I admire Eva Casale tremendously, I think what she does is amazing. I think it is needed to get the word out to the public. It needs to be at the forefront of the American people's minds that freedom isn't free ... Eva is now educating people about that. The fact that she comes here to Warrior Ranch, this is like my favorite event. I think Eva is incredible and it just means the world to me that she makes this one of her stops."

Several area government officials, including Riverhead Town Supervisor Tim Hubbard, presented Ms. Casale with proclamations throughout her trek. Mr. Hubbard applauded Ms. Casale for drawing attention to the needs of veterans and supporting Warrior Ranch.

"The work that the Warrior Ranch does here is incredible — how they help soothe the veterans, EMS workers, police officers," said Mr. Hubbard, who said he has an affinity for horses and horseback riding. "Nothing's better than a horse. [For first responders] to be around them, to help them face their everyday pressures, we're blessed to have this in our township."

The supervisor added that he is thankful that Warrior Ranch helped a Riverhead Police Department officer who "was in a bad accident."

Ms. Casale, a long-distance runner

since age 15, ran her first "Every Veteran Appreciated" chain of marathons in 2016 after meeting several gold star parents whose children died serving the nation. Through the eight events to date — 2020's was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic — she has raised more than \$200,000.

A few hours and a few miles prior to reaching the finish line last Thursday, Ms. Casale and her team also stopped at Calverton National Cemetery. In stark contrast to the celebratory barbecue at Warrior Ranch, she solemnly placed roses on the graves of more than 30 veterans. On Friday, Ms. Casale, whose father and brother served in the armed forces, placed flowers at more locations on the East End, including Lance Corporal Jordan C. Haerter Veterans' Memorial Bridge in Sag Harbor as well as Francis S. Gabreski Air National Guard Base and VFW Post 5350, both in Westhampton.

Members of Team EVA were by her side throughout the weeklong 184mile trek, including support drivers who led and followed the runners, the organizers who planned and mapped the route and four fellow runners who joined Ms. Casale for all seven marathons. Several members of the various communities through which they passed joined the runs as well.

"We're in pain and we're cold and freezing, but this is temporary for us," Kevin Arloff, who ran all seven races alongside Ms. Casale, said at Warrior Ranch after last Thursday's bleak sky and dampness gave way to sunshine and calm. "Soldiers that have fought for our country, are still fighting for our country and the ones that have and passed, that's the ultimate sacrifice they've made. We can make this small little sacrifice and run in the rain in their honor."
